2010 Progressive Dinner - April 17


Adults of all ages should plan to attend this year's progressive dinner to enjoy good food and fellowship!

Belden Lane Coming to SCPC

Belden Lane will speak at our church on Thursday evening, April 15, at 7 PM, compliments of Oasis Ministries and our Henzsey Lecture Series. Belden teaches theology at St. Louis University and has spoken and led retreats the world over. His book, *The Solace of Fierce Landscapes: Desert and Mountain Spirituality*, was instrumental in the planning of Joel's sabbatical a year ago and the two have subsequently become friends. Much of Belden's research and writing has centered on the wisdom and insights of the early church mothers and fathers who fled the Roman Empire in the third century for remote enclaves in the Scetes desert-mountain terrain of Egypt. These hermits, ascetics, and monks fostered contemplative lives based on a poverty of language and self, as well as goods, that lead to what we now call the contemplative tradition. Beldens' talk will center on a spirituality for today with roots in the experience of these early devotees. Belden will also be leading a men's retreat at Krislund the weekend following. Partnership with the Pahk 5 Nan

At the January Presbytery meeting, held here at SCPC, the Presbytery voted to renew our partnership with the Pahk 5 Nan. See details in the article that follows. The Presbytery and our church have a long history with this partnership. We look forward to a double blessing this summer: a visit with the Debbie & Lance Potter family who are working & living in Chang Mai, Thailand, in mid June; then in August, a delegation from the Pahk 5 Nan will be in the states visiting with members of our Presbytery. Watch for more information about those visits and our ongoing relationship with these ministries in Thailand.

Pahk 5 Nan Agreement

Many, but not all of our SCPC members are well-acquainted with the ongoing partnership our Presbytery has with a grouping of the Pahk 5 members located in the Province of Nan in Thailand. Most of us, however, don't remember the many details associated with this partnership. What follows is a capsule summary of some of the high points.

We are entering the fifth 5-year "agreement of understanding" between these two vital bodies, which will be in effect from January 2010 to December 2014. Since 1989 when Don McIlvride spearheaded this endeavor, here is what has been going on:

- Occasional visits to Huntington Presbytery by Pahk 5 Nan members
- Occasional visits to Pahk 5 Nan by our Presbytery members
- For 4 months one Presbytery couple lived in Nan as invited guests
- Letters and phone conversations back and forth
- Regular intercessory prayers by both Church groups – Thailand and United States
- Financial assistance enabling the Pahk to support a coordinator, purchase and maintain a vehicle, supplement occasional visitors' travel. Additionally, monies have helped with evangelism, the building of a new mountain church, and support for Mercy House.
- Endeavors to strengthen the partnership as a spiritual undertaking and learn about each other's culture.

SCPC hosted the January 2010 Presbytery Meeting at which a draft of the FIFTH MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING INTERNATIONAL MISSION PARTNERSHIP was presented. In addition, it was announced that plans are underway to host a small group of our Thai partners for a visit here this coming summer. There are also thoughts about locating a volunteer to teach English As A Second Language (ESL) there in Nan. A need also exists to locate a person who can translate the Thai language into English



Our Response to the Haiti Earthquake

Following the devastating earthquake in Haiti on January 12th, State College Presbyterian Church has certainly answered the call to respond! By the end of January more than \$5800 was sent from the congregation directly to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. More donations are coming in and the work of PDA (and countless other relief organizations) will need continued financial support. We sent over 200 Hygiene kits to Church World Service throughout the month of February. Some of the FISH kids took the request to the high school and got dozens of kits and bags of supplies donated.

Prayers continue for all the people of Haiti, and for those who love Haiti. Rodney & Sharyn Babe, who are long time missionaries in Haiti and friends to this congregation through their support of our Haiti Mission trippers, are both doing well. Sharyn's back was seriously injured during the earthquake but she was able to get evacuated quickly to a hospital in Fort Lauderdale for treatment. She is on the mend, and Rodney was able to join her recently. For more Haiti updates, see the bulletin board in the ground level hallway next to the Fireside Room.

FISH is helping CVIM

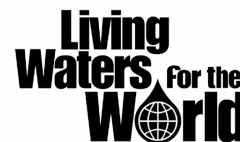

SCPC Members to the Yucatan

The State College Presbyterian Church Mission Ministry Unit is in the final stages of establishing an Operating Partner relationship in the Yucatan for the Living Waters for the World program. SCPC members Tod and Donna McPherson will be traveling to Pencuyut, a town SSE of Merida in the Yucatan, during the second week of March to meet the Pencuyut pastor and community who have requested assistance in the installation of a water purification system. SCPC has received all but formal approval from the Synod of the Peninsula (the LWW organizational group located in the Yucatan) to move ahead.

The March trip is considered a survey and covenant-formation trip. Tod and Donna will travel to Pencuyut to establish a relationship with community leaders and inspect the site the community feels is best able to handle the system. Water availability and testing are part of the information-gathering process, and responsibilities and planning of both Pencuyut and SCPC partners are mapped out. Tod and Donna will visit an existing LWW site in a nearby community and get advice as to the best locations to purchase system supplies for when the installation trip takes place. If all flows smoothly, a summer 2010 installation trip is the goal.

Class descriptions:

"The Book of Nehemiah" Deirdre Fulton concludes this series with a discussion which helps us understand the development of the Jewish religion and culture after their return from the Babylonian exile. We will gain insights for understanding Judaism as it developed in the few centuries before the birth of Christ.

"Update on the Upgraded Krislund Camp" We are pleased to welcome Art DeVos, Program Director for Krislund. He is nearing a full year in his position with the camp and has helped implement stronger and more meaningful programs for youth and adults. He has worked in conjunction with regional Presbyterian churches with our own church's efforts being considerable.

"Adult Education Bible Study" This class began in January and has proven effective and informative as participants discuss biblical issues of interest to the group. Bruce Knoll acts as a facilitator but group interaction enhances the value to those attending. Selected Bible passages are announced ahead of a particular Sunday's class so people can begin to think over discussion areas to include that day.

"Affordable Housing: What's Happening in Centre County" We all are aware of the need for reasonably priced housing within our county. However, we may not be current in our knowledge of the situation as it stands in 2010. Jean Collins will discuss today's status for affordable housing and how we all can get involved to improve housing for those of lower income level. The role of the organization Housing Transition will also be covered.

"Unity and Diversity: Israelite Religion in Monarchic Israel" Jonathan Greer offers this two-week series. Addressing questions about "religion" of Israel in the time of the Hebrew kings of Judah and Israel is a complex endeavor. How did they worship Yahweh, in the "north" as well as the "south"? To what extent was the worship of gods other than Yahweh practiced? What is the theological commentary on these practices? Join us as we explore some of these questions.

"Handel's Messiah and the Bible" Anne Ard and Marty Harbison offer a three-week series on the pertinent music of the Messiah, with an emphasis on the Bible-derived libretto. Included will be short interludes of selected musical portions of this huge work. Emphasis will be on the great ideas with the Bible and how they relate to each other, revealed in the birth, ministry, death, and the Easter Resurrection of Jesus. Ingrained in the Messiah is the people's search for God, Truth, and the Divinity of Christ. Share in learning more of why Handel is considered the greatest of recent century choral writers.

During the Mission Trip, we will be writing to share our experience with you, the Sponsors. Here's a sneak peak at what we expect our trips will be about.....

FISH is going to Pittsburgh this year for its spring break mission trip! We will be staying at the Community House Presbyterian Church in the Northside (right next to Allegheny General Hospital). We have contracted with Pittsburgh Cares to line up work for us within walking distance of the church and will be recreating and showering at the Northside YMCA.

WPF is heading to Tucson to work with Humane Borders and at Southside Presbyterian Church's Cross Street Ministries (where we will be staying). Humane Borders is a humanitarian organization dedicated to creating a just and humane border environment and reducing the number of migrants dying in the desert. We will do some desert fieldwork, interact with their community and explore God's creation in the desert.

Both trips promise to be enriching while we explore the controversial issues involved in our country's inner cities and at the southern border.

Summer Camp 2010 Registration

Registrations are already coming in steadily for 2010 and we offer numerous ways to register for your convenience. A deposit is required in order to guarantee your child's place in this year's summer camp program. We are no longer accepting payments online since it previously required payment in full. After registering online, send a check to the camp or call in with your credit card information for payment. If you do choose to pay in full at the time your form is submitted (via online or paper form), you may also receive a \$10 Full Payment

Discount. (The full payment is the total that YOU owe for the camper after the scholarship total has been taken out.) Krislund does offer a Sibling Discount of \$25 for each camper who is attending a full week event. We are also continuing the Repeat Camper Discount for any camper returning for a second full week of camp in the 2010 summer. Don't delay registering your child as some camps will fill quickly! Upper Lodge Addition in Progress

Last spring, with gifts and labor from the State College Presbyterian Church, the Upper Lodge received a makeover with a new roof, a new deck, new fixtures and a completed ceiling. With the new renovation came a new idea: to add on family friendly bunkrooms. Four new bunkrooms and a storage closet will be added to the lodge and will be attached to the main meeting space of the facility. Each bunkroom will also be equipped with its own bathroom and sitting area. Previous occupants might remember the rustic nature of the cabins including having to take a hike down an unlit path in the middle of the night to use the restrooms. The existing cabins are being dismantled and much of the materials are being repurposed in the construction of the new addition. This will help to alleviate as much cost as possible as well as help us be better stewards of our environment and build this project as green as possible. To date, this project has had a lot of assistance from volunteers from the Huntingdon Presbytery. Krislund Launches New Websites

This past month Krislund has re-launched its primary website, www.krislund.org. The website has a new design and includes much of the same great information as before, as well as a lot of updated and reorganized information. www.krislund.org will focus on our summer camping program, our volunteer program, as well as give basic facts concerning our facilities. Parents can register their child for camp, prospective staff members can fill out an application and volunteers can also submit their information through this website. We also want to utilize this site as a resource for campers to connect to their local Presbyterian churches and give them tools for daily biblical teaching.
