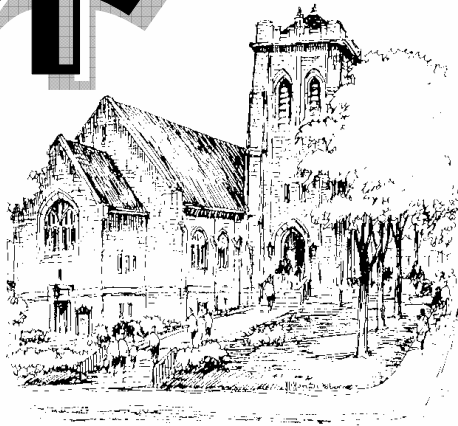

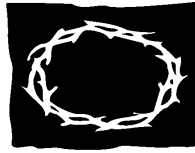

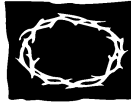

## Holy Week Calendar



### MAUNDY THURSDAY

**10:00 AM, Westminster Hall: "Excavating Jesus: Ten Archeological Discoveries Illuminate the Last Days of Jesus"** will be presented by Pastor Chuck Curley. This is a new presentation which examines some recent discoveries in the Holy Land. Some have received widespread publicity, others are little known. Some are of questionable authenticity, but many add new and reliable information to our knowledge of the life and times of Jesus.

**7:30 PM Maundy Thursday Service** A service of Holy Communion remembering the Last Supper, the betrayal of Jesus, and Jesus praying at Gethsemane. This begins our remembrance of Christ's Passion and leads us towards Easter.



### GOOD FRIDAY

**Noon - 3:00 PM, Community Good Friday Service,** Grace Lutheran Church, 205 S. Garner Street. "People Around the Cross" SCPC will lead the 12:25-12:45 PM segment on Simon of Cyrene.

**7:30 PM Good Friday Service (SCPC)** A haunting service of Tenebrae (meaning "shadows") which uses psalms and readings to remember the crucifixion and death of Jesus. Candles are extinguished in the Church, leaving the congregation in total darkness, and in a silence that is punctuated by the strepitus (a loud clatter intended to evoke the earthquake that was said to happen at the moment of death) meant to evoke the convulsion of nature at the death of Christ. It has also been described as the sound of the tomb door closing.



### EASTER SUNDAY

**6:30 AM, Easter Sunrise Service,** Tudek Park - A service of songs and the good news of the resurrection led by our Confirmation Class.

**8:00 AM, Brief Communion Service,** A short service including communion with Joel Blunk preaching.

**9:00 & 11:15 AM, Festival Celebration of the Resurrection,** with special music by the LOGOS choirs at 9:00 and the Chancel Choir at 11:15. An Easter Orchestra to accompany the choirs, lead the congregation, and provide special music. Also Hallelujah Chorus and Widor's "Toccata". Charles Curley preaching "Get the Picture" (John 20:1-18, John 21:1-14).

## Living Waters Scouting Trip

State College Presbyterian Church's planned water purification project took a huge step forward with Tod and Donna McPherson's recent whirlwind trip to Mexico over Spring Break. Inglesia Nacional Presbiteriana Emmanuel 1 on the Yucatan Peninsula was their destination. The McPhersons flew into the Yucatan city of Merida; the next morning they met their interpreter and drove south to the community of Pencuyut to meet with the pastor and church leaders. The main purpose of this visit was to go to the community requesting Living Waters assistance and assess the feasibility and sustainability of installing a Living Waters for the World (LWW) water purification system. Pastor Ismael May had heard from the region's LWW coordinator about the visit and several church members were waiting for Tod and Donna with welcoming smiles and traditional Yucatan food.

This survey and partnership trip included spending time getting to know the leaders, finding out their goals and dreams for the community, and ascertaining if a water purification system will help them in their evangelism. The church community wants to help the less fortunate in the area and is hoping to be able to do so with affordable agua de purifico (purified water) produced on the church grounds. They are willing to convert an old convent structure to Yucatan health department regulations in order to operate a self-sustaining business that includes tithing water production to aid the needy.

Tod and Donna learned that the community receives municipal water for only five hours each day and has an old well on the church grounds. Both were tested for purity on-site, showing that the water is typical for the Yucatan: extremely hard, contaminated with biological organisms, and showing no evidence of chlorine that the Yucatan health department says they add to help the water. General improvements to the well would have to be made before it could supplement the municipal water. Samples of the well water and municipal water were collected for further analysis at a lab in Georgia. Although the convent structure is sufficiently large, it will need several modifications and repairs. Tod and Donna were impressed with the input of the men in designing the space. The commitment of the Pencuyut people to complete the necessary work in the identified timeframe will be key to further financial commitment from SCPC.

Tod and Donna discussed a detailed business plan and sustainability study with some of the Pencuyut elders and met health and spiritual educators who hope to be trained as teachers during our SCPC installation. The community provided the McPhersons with a traditional meal, a walking tour of the town and even the opportunity to play with a beach ball with some of the children. Tod and Donna concluded their two day visit with many hugs and pictures!

Freddie, the interpreter, took Donna and Tod to two currently running LWW sites and a non-LWW purification facility so they could talk to the operators and ask questions about the everyday issues they face. The people were all very friendly and gave tours of their sites. The travelers also made a stop at a Franciscan church and a Mayan ruin and took notes on other places of interest that our installation team might want to see.

Tod and Donna look forward to sharing their experiences in a future adult education class as we plan our next steps in helping Pencuyut have access to clean water.

## Henszey Lecture Event - Belden Lane

Belden Lane will speak at our church on Thursday evening, April 15 at 7:00 PM compliments of Oasis Ministries and our Henszey Lecture Series. His talk is entitled, "Landscapes of the Sacred and the Spiritual Life." In this conversation, Belden will introduce us to the power of sacred places in our lives, how we experience particular (often ordinary) places as able to mediate God's presence, and how this is exemplified in Native American, Protestant, and Irish/Spanish Catholic spirituality. Belden teaches theology at St. Louis University and has spoken and led retreats the world over. His book, *The Solace of Fierce Landscapes: Desert and Mountain Spirituality*, was instrumental in the planning of Joel's sabbatical a year ago and the two have subsequently become friends. Much of Belden's research and writing has centered on the wisdom and insights of the early church mothers and fathers who fled the Roman Empire in the third century for remote enclaves in the Scetes desert-mountain terrain of Egypt. These hermits, ascetics, and monks fostered contemplative lives based on a poverty of language and self, as well as goods, that led to what we now call the contemplative tradition. Belden's talk will center on a spirituality for today with roots in the experience of these early devotees. Belden will also be leading a men's retreat at Krislund the weekend following. ## Parking Reminder Update

### Class descriptions:

**"Handel's Messiah and the Bible"** Anne Ard and Marty Harbison conclude their three-week series on the Messiah, with an emphasis on the Bible-derived libretto. Short selected portions of this huge work are included. Focus is on the great ideas of the Bible and how they relate to each other, especially aspects which relate to this Easter day. Ingrained in the Messiah is one's search for God, Truth, and the Divinity of Christ.

**"FISH Report on Their Pittsburgh Mission"** Some 70 senior high students and a dozen adults traveled to Pittsburgh for a mission experience in a new location. They worked with the organization "Pittsburgh Cares" in the Northside area. Responsibilities included cleaning group homes, painting, yard work, and working with children. The youth will offer interesting and inspiring examples of their experiences.

**"Adult Education Bible Study"** Note that there will be no class on Easter, but on April 11th we will be looking at three of the parables of the kingdom. Then on April 18th we'll study the traditions surrounding Abraham, the founder of the three monotheistic religions in the world today, and why he is important for Christians. On April 25th Shirley Berling will guide us in a study of the special gifts that disabled people can bring to the church. The Sunday bulletin will have more complete descriptions with Bible verses to read in preparation.

**"WPF Youth Mission to Tucson"** About a dozen college-age youth and adults traveled to Arizona for a unique first-time experience in that Southwest city. Using a church as a staging area and living quarters, they worked in aspects of need prominent in that area, including immigration issues, homelessness, and other related needs. Their report will be informative and rewarding.

**"The Lost Gospels"** John Swisher offers this intriguing class. We will explore four of the many lost Gospels including Mary, Thomas, Philip, and Judas and think about their implications. Each of these disciples held a different view of what Jesus said or did. These disciples will raise questions for us to ponder. John will include a Power Point presentation.
