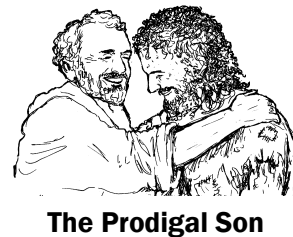
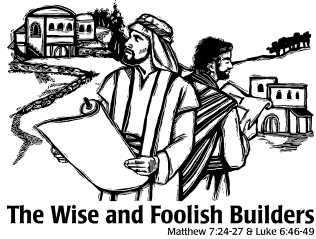


SUMMER SUNDAY SCHOOL 2011


